

Common Linux Commands

cd x (or cd /x)	Chage into directory x
ls	List the contents of a directory
pwd	Show the present working directory you are in.
cat x	View file x.
mv x y	Move file X and rename it Y
rm x	Remove file x
mkdir x	Make a directory named x
rmdir x	Remove a directory named x
locate x	Locate file x

rpm Installation:

rpm -ivh somepackage.rpm	Install package somepackage.rpm
rpm -e somepackage.rpm	Remove package somepackage.rpm
rpm -Uvh somepackage.rpm	Upgrade package somepackage.rpm
rpm -q somepackage.rpm installed	Check to see if somepackage.rpm is installed
